PHILOSOPER'S CORNER

TOM

"As an aspiring cartoonist, I think a lot about how so many people have such interesting stories but don't think of themselves as storytellers. Storytelling is, like singing or dancing, a skill any child can do. Yet when most folks grow out of childhood, they leave storytelling behind, believing it's only for people with 'born talent', or for those who've paid for years of training. That's a shame because nowadays most professionals in the worlds of storytelling (such as books, movies and tv, and graphic novels) have come to realize that getting back to that childlike mindset is the key to creating work that can touch the most people.

Ernest Hemingway became one of the greatest American novelists <u>using simple and direct language</u>. Over fifty years after Alfred Hitchcock's death, he's still one of the <u>most influential and widely studied</u> movie directors. Hitchcock also had the ability to powerfully communicate in the simple language we grow up hearing as children. He pulled from his own inner-city upbringing to tell thrilling stories that spoke to a broader audience's everyday fears and desires.

In my day job, as a front-end developer for the NYC
Parks' website, I use similar techniques to try to ensure that people can easily access information about the City's public outdoor spaces and recreation activities. Trayce, the creator of the Story Sharing Game, asked me to apply those skills as an advisor to the game, looking for any areas in the lessons where readability could be improved. Trayce has poured so much of her experience, insight, empathy, research, and humor into the Game that I couldn't simply read the materials and report back; I was pulled into doing the exercises and applying them to my cartooning work.

The Story Sharing Game is expertly designed to offer big benefits to people of all ages, experience levels, and walks of life. It's a free, fun, and supportive experience that can awaken the storyteller in anyone, give them the tools to shape their stories, and the characters in them, in simple and powerful ways. Catering 2Us then provides an online platform for storytellers to bring their stories into the world."



The Story Sharing Game is hosted on the Catering2Us website, part of Brooklyn Young Filmmakers Center (BYFC) larger vision for a People's Hollywood. BYFC (which has not had a public office since 2014) is a small all-volunteer non-profit that was founded by the Game's creator in 2003 to experiment with different kinds of services and philosophies for melding the teaching of storytelling skills and hands-on-experiences in low/no budget filmmaking with self-development tools for adult beginners and their families. For the last few years, a tiny board has maintained BYFC as our work went underground in pursuit of developing content for online education.
